COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our students will progress through 4 units of study that weave in reading, writing, speaking/listening, and research.

When is Late/Redo Work going to be graded and put into the gradebook? Late/Redo work will go into the gradebook AFTER ALL CURRENT work is graded.




